Application Instructions

- 3) Complete Part B - As noted in Table I, fill out this form for each individual membership. (Make as many copies of Part B as necessary).

Example: Your facility has an average daily flow rate of 5 mgd. From Table I, you are in the "C" category. This authorizes your facility to four (4) individual memberships as listed. This will require you to submit four (4) completed Part B's (one for each individual member). Additionally, complete Part A, submit with completed Part B's and voucher. PWO (Professional Wastewater Operator) - For individuals working on a day-to-day basis in a wastewater collection, treatment or laboratory facility.

Active - For individuals involved in engineering, administrative, regulatory agencies, manufacture, manufactures representatives, and those engaged in the management, supervision of wastewater collection and treatment facilities. An Active member is also a member of the Federation, and an eligible voting member with all rights and privileges granted by the Federation including the right to hold office and serve on committees.
