WHAT EXACTLY DOES A GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS SPECIALIST DO?

The work involves responsibility for assisting in the planning, development and coordination of a Geographic Information System. A Geographic Information Specialist uses GIS software to create, modify, analyze, and display geographic data in order to meet the spatial data needs of the County. This is an important role at WEP, and the ideal candidate will have numerous responsibilities including, but not limited to:

- Assist in the design and modification of a Geographic Information System.
- Responsible for collecting, storing and maintaining spatial data and metadata.
- Interact with various departments and outside agencies involved in planning and development activities.
- Provide technical advice to user departments.
- Analyze user requests and better define user needs and develop solutions based on those needs.
- Develop and maintain a workplan addressing user needs and projecting future system enhancements.
- ❖ Handles requests from the public for maps and geographic data.
- Responsible for acquiring, cataloging, filing and maintaining manual and digital maps.
