WHAT EXACTLY DOES A PUMP STATION MAINTENANCE WORKER I DO?

The primary functions are to maintain and repair a variety of equipment such as submersible and portable trash pumps, grid educators and high velocity water cleaners, sewage force mains and ancillary equipment, and a variety of alarms, circuitry, and meters and controls. This is an important role at WEP, and duties will include but are not limited to:

- Assists in the inspection of wastewater treatment pump stations, which includes but is not limited to, recording and evaluating time lapse and flow chart pump readings and inspecting and testing malfunction alarms.
- Assists in the maintenance and repair of equipment found in wastewater treatment pump stations, which includes but is not limited to, removing grease, grit, sludge, and screenings from wet well areas.
- Maintains the appearance of wastewater treatment pump stations washing wet well areas, sweeping and mopping floors, and cleaning windows, control panels and other equipment.
- Maintains the appearance and condition of grounds by plowing and/or shoveling snow and cutting and trimming grass, hedges, and trees.
- Assists in maintaining the condition of vehicles, tools, and maintenance equipment used in wastewater treatment pump station maintenance and repair.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

One (1) year of work experience, or its part-time equivalent, in the maintenance and repair of mechanical, electrical, or instrumentation equipment.

<u>Special necessary requirement</u>: When required to operate a motor vehicle, possession of a valid New York State non-CDL or CDL, including any special endorsements, as required for the type of vehicle being operated.
